Dear Mr. Ballas:

Pursuant to the Clean Water Act § 505, 33 U.S.C. § 1365, and 40 C.F.R. Part 135, Subpart A, you are hereby notified that after the expiration of 60 days following service of this notice, Conservation Alabama Foundation, Inc. may file suit against the Utilities Board of the City of Linden for discharges of pollutants from the Board's HCR Lagoon into Sycamore Creek in violation of the limitations and conditions of NPDES Permit No. AL0045683 as reported in Discharge Monitoring Reports submitted by the Board to the Alabama Department of Environmental Management from September 2003 to September 2008, including but not limited to, the following:



The plaintiff, or if the plaintiff is represented by counsel, then the plaintiff's attorney, shall complete and sign the 'general information' portion of the cover sheet before it is filed with the court. If the complaint is tendered to the clerk of the circuit court without a properly completed cover sheet, the clerk shall accept the complaint and inform the person filing it of the requirements of this rule, and the plaintiff, or, if the plaintiff is represented by counsel, then the plaintiff's attorney, shall promptly file a properly completed cover sheet."

For a party's failure to comply with the requirements of Rule 3, ARCP, a court may stay the proceedings until the cover sheet is filed or make such other orders as are just, such as contempt of court, or, after proper notice, an order dismissing the action. Additionally, in cases appealed from the district court to the circuit court, the cover sheet shall accompany the notice of appeal.

COMPLAINT

The Parties

- 1. The Attorney General is authorized by Ala. Code § 22-22A-5(1), § 22-22-9(m), § 22-22A-5(12), and § 22-22A-5(18) (2006 Rplc. Vol.) to enforce the provisions of the Alabama Water Pollution Control Act (hereinafter "AWPCA"), which is found at Ala. Code §§ 22-22-1 through 22-22-14 (2006 Rplc. Vol.). Specifically, Ala. Code § 22-22A-5(18)(b) (2006 Rplc. Vol.) authorizes the Attorney General to bring a civil action for violation of permits issued under the AWPCA and for unpermitted discharges of pollutants in violation of said Act. In addition, Ala. Code § 22-22A-5(18)(c) (2006 Rplc. Vol.) authorizes the Attorney General to recover civil penalties for such permit violations and unpermitted discharges of pollutants, providing for a maximum of \$25,000.00 per violation. The Attorney General is authorized by Ala. Code § 36-15-12 (2006 Rplc. Vol.) to institute and prosecute, in the name of the State, all civil actions and other proceedings necessary to protect the rights and interests of the State.
 - 2. The Alabama Department of Environmental Management (hereinafter "the

Department" or "ADEM") is a duly constituted department of the State of Alabama pursuant to Ala. Code §§ 22-22A-1 through 22-22A-16 (2006 Rplc. Vol.). Pursuant to Ala. Code § 22-22A-4(n) (2006 Rplc. Vol.), the Department is the state agency responsible for the promulgation and enforcement of water pollution control regulations in accordance with the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, 33 U.S.C. §§ 1251 to 1387. In addition, the Department is authorized to administer and enforce the provisions of the AWPCA.

3. The Utilities Board of the City of Linden (hereinafter "the Permittee") operates a wastewater treatment facility located at the Linden HCR Lagoon on Caroline Street, Linden, Alabama in Marengo County, Alabama. The wastewater treatment facility discharges pollutants from a point source at Outfall 001 into Sycamore Creek, a water of the State.

Jurisdiction and Venue

4. The Court has jurisdiction and venue over this Complaint pursuant to Ala. Code § 22-22A-5(18)(b) and § 22-22A-5(19) (2006 Rplc. Vol.).

General Allegations

- 5. The Defendant's Permit was originally issued by ADEM on January 1, 2000 and expired on December 31, 2004; the permit was re-issued on February 1, 2005 with an expiration date of January 31, 2010. The Permit establishes limitations, terms, and conditions on the discharge of pollutants from a point source into Sycamore Creek. The Permit requires that the Permittee monitor its discharges and submit periodic Discharge Monitoring Reports (hereinafter DMR's) to the Department describing the results of the monitoring. The Permit also requires that the Permittee maintain in good working order all systems used by the Permittee to achieve compliance with the terms and conditions of the Permit.
- 6. The DMR's reports submitted to the Department by the Permittee indicate that the

Permittee has discharged pollutants from such point source at Ourfall 001 into the aforementioned Sycamore Creek in violation of the limitations established in the Permit. The months the violations occurred along with the parameters violated are listed in Attachment 1, which is incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein.

Count I

- 7. Plaintiffs repeat, replead and incorporate by reference paragraphs 1 through 6, above.
 - 8. The above violations are due to be abated by injunction.

Count II

- 9. Plaintiffs repeat, replead and incorporate by reference paragraphs 1 through 8, above.
- 10. Pursuant to <u>Ala. Code</u> § 22-22A-5(18) (2006 Rplc. Vol.), a civil penalty is due to be assessed for the referenced violations.

PRAYER FOR RELIEF

WHEREFORE, Plaintiffs respectfully request that the Court:

- A. Take jurisdiction over this matter.
- B. Adjudge and declare that the Permittee violated the limitations, terms, and conditions of the Permit.
- C. Adjudge and declare that the Permittee caused or allowed unpermitted discharges of pollutants from its wastewater treatment facility into a water of the State.
- D. Order the Permittee to take action to ensure that similar violations of the AWPCA will not recur in the future.

- E. Assess a civil penalty against the Permittee and in favor of Plaintiffs pursuant to Ala. Code §§ 22-22A-5(18)(b) and (c) (2006 Rplc. Vol.) for each and every violation of the Permit alleged in this Complaint.
 - F. Tax the costs of this action against the Defendant.
 - G. Order such other relief that the Court deems proper.
